The City Council of the City of Sachse held a regular meeting on Monday, June 4, 2018 at 7:30 p.m. at the City Council Chambers, 3815 Sachse Road, Sachse, Texas. Those present were Mayor Mike Felix, Mayor Pro Tem Paul Watkins, Councilmembers Brett Franks, Charlie Ross, Bill Adams, Cullen King, and Jeff Bickerstaff; City Manager, Gina Nash; City Secretary, Michelle Lewis Sirianni; Assistant to the City Manager, Lauren Rose; Development Services Director, Dusty McAfee; Finance Director, Teresa Savage; Parks and Recreation Director, Lance Whitworth; Human Resources Director, Melinda Walter; Fire Chief, Marty Wade; Fire Marshal, Robert Knappage, and Police Chief, Bryan Sylvester.

Mayor Felix opened the meeting at 8:09 p.m.

Councilman Ross announced that the Library will kick-off the 2018 Summer Reading Club program on Saturday, June 9 at 10:00 a.m.

Mayor Felix awarded Sachse High School Senior Brandon Ramirez with a \$1,000 scholarship, furnished by Republic Services.

18-4273 – Recognize the winners of the 2018 Fired Up for Literature Program.

Fire Marshal Robert Knappage announced the winners from the 2018 Fired Up for Literature reading contest. For 10 days, students tracked their reading time and the student with the most logged reading time from each school would receive a ride to school in a firetruck and a backpack. The school with the most read hours/minutes received the school trophy for one year.

The reading times for all four schools totaled 1,199 hours in 10 days. The winning school was Sewell Elementary with a total of 661 hours.

REGULAR AGENDA ITEMS:

18-4275 Receive a presentation regarding the new My Sachse Community Connect platform.

Mrs. Nash stated the City was able to collaborate with Imaginuity that has been working with the Sachse EDC to create *My Sachse Community Connect*. The platform allows users to utilize their Amazon or Google virtual assistants to seek information about the community.

Mrs. Rose demonstrated abilities of the platform by asking Amazon Alexa questions.

Mrs. Nash commented the City will work with Imaginuity to change topics and is a way to market the community. Sachse is the second city in Texas to offer this tool to residents.

Councilman Adams asked if there was a plan for getting this out to citizens. Mrs. Nash responded the City will use their social media platforms and the City website to promote the application.

Councilman King asked if there was a specific date of when it would be available. Mrs. Rose replied that Imaginuity will submit the utterances to Amazon and Google for approval, which can take from five to 10 days. Staff anticipates that the platform will be available to residents later this month.

18-4283 Receive and discuss a presentation of the City's Multi-Year Financial Plan.

Mrs. Nash stated Becky Brooks with Government Resource Associates met with City Council in February and presented Phase I of the plan as part of its strategic planning retreat. She will be presenting an abbreviated version to the public in preparation of the upcoming budget process.

Ms. Brooks presented the findings of Phase I, which consisted primarily of the General Fund and Debt Fund. Phase II and III will continue in 2019-2020 with expansion to other funds and CIP enhancements with the project transitioning from the consultant to staff.

Mrs. Brooks highlighted and presented the following:

- Financial stewardship policies, which contained revenue and expenditure management, budget balancing, tax strategy, and debt management
- Revenue projection strategies, which included property value, sales tax, and all other assumptions
- Revenue graphs regarding growth assumptions, population estimates, impacts to property tax base, "current" property tax revenues for the General Fund, and total General Fund revenues
- Expenditure strategies, which included baseline expenditures by category and supplemental programs projections
- Expenditure graphs depicting total General Fund expenses by category and projected General Fund
- Fund balance: projected versus target
- Capital projects
- Debt service projections
- Financing capital

Ms. Brooks stated the City has a solid financial management plan and fund stability, and is favorably positioned for the future.

Mayor Pro Tem Watkins commented on the growth assumption of materials having a 2-3% growth rate, but he believes should be more around 10-12%. Councilman Adams added as the plan is refreshed each year, he likes being able to keep an eye on the long term.

Mrs. Nash stated in preparation of the budget, the City added two visual boards reflecting the distribution of a tax bill and a tax rate comparison. These will be added to the City's social media and website for residents.

- Three (3) seats held by any qualified residents.

The City Council met on three different occasions to interview applicants. A total of twelve applicants were interviewed with four (4) of them being from the current Parks and Recreation Board and eight (8) being brand new applicants.



Preliminary Engineering Funding Agreement: Pleasant Valley Road.

Background

Dallas County is seeking to partner with both the City of Sachse and the City of Wylie on the preliminary engineering of Pleasant Valley Road. The project scope is shown in Attachment A.

Based upon past discussion on this item at the January 16, 2018 City Council Meeting, Dallas County has made minor alterations to the agreement language to reflect its understanding that the City of Garland is responsible for the maintenance of the current road.

Staff met with the City of Garland to discuss both the current maintenance concerns and the future partnership to improve the road. Staff will continue to coordinate with the City of Garland, with the goal of meeting the needs of our citizens.

Preliminary engineering is required to determine the necessary improvements within the corridor when the project is constructed in the future. The scope of the preliminary engineering project will include alignment studies, traffic volume (current and future) assessments, drainage and utility analysis, floodplain analysis and bridge studies at the two bridge crossings, and right-of-way studies.

Dallas County has recommended that the preliminary engineering be completed in order to better understand the project needs so that a budget can be established for final engineering and construction. This will allow City of Sachse, Dallas County, and the City of Wylie to work with additional stakeholders, including the City of Garland, to determine funding contributions.

Policy Considerations


The City of Sachse and Dallas County regularly partner on the design and construction of major roadway projects in the city. The project is listed in the City of Sachse's Capital Improvement Plan and Dallas County's Major Capital Improvement Program.

Budgetary Considerations

The total project budget for the preliminary engineering of Pleasant Valley Road is \$1,000,000.00. The City of Sachse's portion of the costs of preliminary engineering will be \$300,000.00. Dallas County has pledged \$500,000.00 and the City of Wylie has pledged \$200,000.00. Project funding is proposed to come from Roadway Impact Fees.

Staff Recommendations

Staff recommends approving a resolution regarding the terms and conditions of the Funding Agreement in order to contract for the implementation of the major capital transportation improvement project with Dallas County for the preliminary engineering of Pleasant Valley Road.



Master Thoroughfare Plan

- Pleasant Valley Road is listed as a minor arterial in the Master Thoroughfare Plan.
- The road is currently a 2-lane asphalt roadway.
- The proposed preliminary engineering project will identify the needed improvements of the road and an estimated cost of the improvements.



Dallas County MCIP


- Dallas County regularly partners with cities to improve major road corridors throughout the County. This work is done through their Public Works Major Capital Improvement Program (MCIP).
- The City of Sachse has benefited greatly from the strong relationship that we have had with Dallas County Commissioner Mike Cantrell and the staff at Dallas County Public Works.
- Through this relationship we have successfully recently completed the widening of Merritt Road south, the preliminary engineering of Sachse Road, and are beginning construction on the widening of Sachse Road/5th Street.
- The Dallas County MCIP program is a great way to make our citizen's tax dollars go further through the 50/50 match.

Project Overview

- Based on feedback from the January 16, 2018 City Council meeting, Dallas County tweaked the language of the Funding Agreement based on its understanding that the City of Garland provides maintenance of Pleasant Valley Road.
- Preliminary engineering is required to determine the necessary improvements within the corridor when the project is constructed in the future.
- The scope of the preliminary engineering project will include alignment studies, traffic volume (current and future) assessments, drainage and utility analysis, floodplain analysis and bridge studies at the two bridge crossings, and right-of-way studies.
- The project budget is \$1,000,000.00. The proposed funding breakdown is:
 - Dallas County \$500,000.00
 - City of Sachse \$300,000.00
 - City of Wylie \$200,000.00 (already approved)

Project Map

- Pleasant Valley Road in Dallas County traverses through both the City of Sachse and the City of Wylie.
- Approximately 3/5 of the road is in Sachse, with the other 2/5 of the road being in/adjacent to the City of Wylie.



City of Garland Involvement

- Staff has met with the City of Garland to discuss both the current maintenance concerns and future partnership to improve the road. Staff will continue to coordinate with the City of Garland, with the goal of meeting the needs of our citizens.
- The preliminary engineering will allow Sachse to better understand the ultimate needs of the roadway, and thus be in a position to work with Dallas County and the City of Garland to negotiate Garland's involvement in funding final design and construction.

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends the approval of a resolution authorizing the terms and conditions of the Funding Agreement in order to contract for the implementation of the major capital transportation improvement project with Dallas County for the preliminary engineering of Pleasant Valley Road.

Next Steps

- City Council to consider approval of the Resolution.
- Dallas County will go through their selection process to put together a team of County staff and outside consultants for the project.
- ■Staff will begin coordination with Dallas County on kicking off the project in the fall/winter of 2018/2019.
- The project will be included in the Capital Improvement Plan as a part of the FY 2018-2019 budget.

EXHIBIT "A" Funding Agreement

DALLAS COUNTY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM FUNDING AGREEMENT

The City of Sachse, Texas, hereinafter called "City", and the County of Dallas, Texas, hereinafter called "County", desire to enter into a Funding Agreement, hereinafter called "FA", in order to contract for the implementation of the Major Capital Improvement Project authorized by Court Order 2011-896 dated May 17, 2011, which approved specified projects including Pleasant Valley Road MCIP 28201 Project from Merritt Road to the Dallas County Line, hereinafter called "Project".

Witnesseth

WHEREAS, the Project is located within the Cities of Sachse and Wylie; and

WHEREAS, the County has requested that it be designated as the Lead Agency for the Project and will provide the Project Manager; and

WHEREAS, City and County entered into a Master Agreement Governing Major Capital Improvement Program (Master Agreement) on May 17, 2011, by Commissioners Court Order 2011-896, for the purpose of transportation improvements on roads inside Dallas County; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code and Chapters 251 and 472 of the Texas Transportation Code provide authorization for local governments to contract with each other for the performance of governmental functions and services, and joint funding of road or street projects.

NOW THEREFORE THIS FUNDING AGREEMENT is made by and entered into by the City and the County for the mutual consideration stated herein.

Article I **Project Funding Agreement**

This FA is between the County and the City to establish a preliminary proposed budget for the Project which will facilitate the movement of public transportation to benefit both the City and County. This FA is to specifically identify the Project as well as any changes in the rights and responsibilities of each of the parties as set forth in the Master Agreement which is hereby incorporated herein as if written word for word and any additions thereto. All terms of the Master Agreement remain in full force and effect except as modified herein. In the event of any conflict between the Master Agreement and this FA, this FA shall control.

Article II Incorporated Documents

This FA incorporates, as if fully reproduced herein word for word and number for number, the following items:

- 1. Master Agreement authorized by Commissioners Court Order 2011-896, dated May 17, 2011, and additions thereto as incorporated herein.
- 2. Attachment "A", the Project Location Map, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

3. Attachment "B", the Current Cost Estimates and Funding Sources, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

Article III Term of Agreement

This FA shall become effective when signed by the last party whose signature makes the respective agreement fully executed. This FA will remain in effect until:

- 1. Incorporation into the Project Specific Agreement; or
- 2. Termination upon the terms and conditions as set forth in the Master Agreement, Article IV Section A, Termination.

Article IV Project Description

This FA is entered into by the parties to provide the Preliminary Feasibility Study and/or the final approved preliminary engineering, specifications and estimates (hereinafter "PS&E") which will define the Project. The Project is defined as the widening of the existing Pleasant Valley Road from a two lane asphalt roadway to a planned four lane concrete section from Merritt Road to the Dallas County Line. The Project also includes three bridges and stormwater improvements. The City does hereby give its approval for expenditure of County funds for the construction, improvement, maintenance, or repair of a street located within the municipality.

The Preliminary Feasibility Study and/or PS&E will be submitted to the City for approval, prior to proceeding with the final design and any right-of-way acquisition. The City shall review and comment on the PS&E within thirty (30) days after delivery to the City. If the County has not received comments within thirty (30) days of the PS&E's delivery to the City, the County will assume the City has reviewed the plans, had no comments and proceed with the Project. Upon PS&E approval, this FA shall be incorporated into a Project Specific Agreement (PSA), and continue as the source of authorization for proceeding with the Project pending approval of the PSA.

Article V Fiscal Funding

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, this FA is expressly contingent upon the availability of County funding for each item and obligation contained herein. City shall have no right of action against the County of Dallas as regards this FA, specifically including any funding by County of the Project in the event that the County is unable to fulfill its obligations under this FA as a result of the lack of sufficient funding for any item or obligation from any source utilized to fund this FA or failure of any funding party to budget or authorize funding for this FA during the current or future fiscal years. In the event of insufficient funding, or if funds become unavailable in whole or part, the County, at its sole discretion, may provide funds from a separate source or terminate this FA. In the event that payments or expenditures are made, they shall be made from current funds as required by Chapter 791, Texas Government Code.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein, this FA is expressly contingent upon the availability of City funding for each item and obligation contained herein. County shall have no right of action against the City as regards this FA, specifically including any funding by City of the Project in the event that the City is unable to fulfill its obligations under this FA as a result of the lack of

sufficient funding for any item or obligation from any source utilized to fund this FA or failure of any funding party to budget or authorize funding for this FA during the current or future fiscal years. In the event of insufficient funding, or if funds become unavailable in whole or part, the City, as its sole discretion, may provide funds from a separate source or terminate this FA. In the event that payments or expenditures are made, they shall be made from current funds as required by Chapter 791, Texas Government Code.

Article VI Agreements

I. <u>County and City Responsibilities:</u>

- 1. County will be the Lead Agency for the Project.
- 2. City and County have mutually agreed that the Project limits are from Merritt Road to Elm Grove Road in the City of Sachse and from Elm Grove Road to the Dallas County Line in the City of Wylie.
- 3. County and City will execute the necessary agreements for the implementation of design and construction of the Project mutually agreed-upon and incorporated herein by this FA.
- 4. The Project may require the acquisition of road right-of-way within the alignment which is all real property needed or convenient for roadway purposes as shown in the Project design or right-of-way plans and shall include all real property outside of the designed right-of-way needed or convenient to the construction, drainage, interface with adjoining streets or alleys, driveways or other access ways or other Project permanent or temporary easements which is approved by the City and County. Such right-of-way acquisition shall be the responsibility of the County as Lead Agency, and shall be funded as part of the Project costs. Such acquisitions will be transferred into the City's name as owner as the City will be solely responsible for maintenance after construction is completed.

II. City Responsibilities:

- 1. City of Sachse will attend all Project task force meetings and public meetings.
- 2. City of Sachse shall review and comment on all drawings and documents within thirty (30) days after delivery to the City. If the County has not received comments within thirty (30) days after delivery to the City, the County will assume the City has reviewed the plans, had no comments, and proceed with the Project.
- 3. City of Sachse is the owner of the property listed in Article IV Project Description, which is incorporated herein by reference.
- 4. City of Sachse will continue to be the owner of the property listed in Article IV Project Description, which is incorporated herein by reference, after the project is completed.
- 5. City or its designee shall be responsible for maintaining the roadway, improvements, grading area, drainage structures, striping, and signage after the Project is complete.

III. County Responsibilities:

- 1. County shall use the total funding committed by the City and the County solely for the purpose of eligible Project costs.
- 2. County shall inform the City of all Project activity and approvals.
- 3. County shall provide a final accounting of Project costs once the planning is complete and accepted by the City. The accounting shall have sufficient detail for the Auditor to verify Project costs.

4. Dallas County will not maintain the roadway, improvements, grading area, drainage structures, striping, and signage after the Project is complete.

Article VII Funding

County and City mutually agree to proportionately fund the Direct Project and Program cost as follows and as summarized in Attachment "B":

- 1. Notwithstanding any provision in the Master Agreement, this FA, any amendment thereto, or any other agreement between the parties regarding this Project, the total Project cost is estimated to be <u>One Million Dollars and Zero Cents</u> (\$1,000,000.00), as <u>shown in Attachment "B."</u> The County's total obligation to this Project is to provide funding in the amount not to exceed <u>Five Hundred Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents</u> (\$500,000.00), reduced by all County in-house delivery costs of the total Project cost.
- 2. The County's in-house Preliminary Design and Project Delivery costs may include all County in-house Project delivery costs ("IHPD") including but not limited to preliminary scoping and research, preliminary design services, special services, primary design services, right-of-way acquisition, administration, inspection, laboratory services and construction.
- 3. The City agrees to provide funding for the Project in the amount not to exceed <u>Three Hundred Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$300,000.00)</u>. City agrees to encumber an amount adequate for total estimated Project costs as determined prior to the commencement of each Project milestone as determined by County within thirty (30) days of notification by the County. The City will pay Project costs as invoiced by the County.
- 4. County shall execute a Funding Agreement with the City of Wylie for the remaining Two Hundred Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$200,000.00) of the total Project cost.
- 5. Any payments to be made by any party hereto shall be from current revenue or other lawfully available funds in accordance with Chapter 791, Texas Government Code.
- 6. Preliminary cost estimates will be generated to review the adequacy of the project budget. The Project scope will be modified as agreed by City and County to remain within the estimated cost, if necessary.

Article VIII Miscellaneous

- I. <u>No Third Party Beneficiaries.</u> The terms and provisions of this FA are for the benefit of the parties hereto and not for the benefit of any third party. It is the express intention of City and County that any entity other than City or County receiving services or benefits under this FA shall be deemed an incidental beneficiary only. This FA is intended only to set forth the contractual right and responsibilities of the parties hereto.
- II. <u>Applicable Law.</u> This FA is and shall be expressly subject to the Sovereign Immunity of County and Governmental Immunity of City, Title 5 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code, as amended, and all applicable federal and state laws. This FA shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws and case decisions of the State of Texas. Exclusive venue for any legal action regarding this FA filed by either City or County shall be in Dallas County, Texas.
- III. <u>Notice</u>. Any notice provided for in this Agreement to be given by either party to the other, shall be required to be in writing and shall be deemed given when personally delivered, or two

(2) business days after being deposited in the United States Mail, postage prepaid, by certified mail, return receipt requested; or by registered mail and addressed as follows:

Either party may change its address for notice by giving the other party notice thereof.

- IV. <u>Assignment</u>. This FA may not be assigned or transferred by either party without the prior written consent of the other party.
- V. <u>Binding Agreement; Parties Bound.</u> This FA has been duly executed and delivered by both parties and constitutes a legal, valid and binding obligation of the parties, their successors and permitted assigns.
- VI. <u>Amendment.</u> This FA may not be amended except in a written instrument specifically referring to this FA and signed by the parties hereto.
- VII. <u>Number and Gender.</u> Words of any gender used in this FA shall be held and construed to include any other gender and words in the singular shall include the plural and vice versa, unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
- VIII. <u>Effective Date.</u> This FA shall commence on the Effective Date. The Effective Date of this FA shall be the date it is executed by the last of the parties. Reference to the date of execution shall mean the Effective Date.
- IX. <u>Counterparts.</u> This FA may be executed in multiple counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- X. <u>Severability.</u> If one or more of the provisions in this FA shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not cause this FA to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable, but this FA shall be construed as if such provision had never been contained herein, and shall not affect the remaining provisions of this FA, which shall remain in full force and effect.
- XI. <u>Entire Agreement.</u> This FA embodies the complete agreement of the parties, supersedes all oral or written previous and contemporary agreements between the parties and relating to matters in the FA.
- XII. <u>Contingent</u>. This Agreement is expressly subject to and contingent upon formal approval by the Dallas County Commissioners Court and by resolution of the City Council.

Merritt Road Project Update

Background

The City of Sachse has been working with the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) on creating regional partnerships to fully fund the construction of Merritt Road, from Sachse Road to Pleasant Valley Road. The project scope will also include traffic and pedestrian improvements along Woodbridge Parkway to the north.

Staff has been regularly attending the Regional Transportation Council and Surface Transportation Technical Committee meetings in Arlington as the project has gone through the state and local funding processes. In addition, staff has been meeting with TxDOT as well as completing the paperwork and preparations necessary to finalize the project later this year.

Policy Considerations

There are no policy considerations affiliated with this item.

Budgetary Considerations

The total estimated project budget is \$21,000,000.00. The City of Sachse has provided \$5,000,000.00 in project funding. The NCTCOG Regional Transportation Council has allocated \$10,000,000.00 in project funding toward the project for 2018-2019, in order to get the project moving forward and fully fund engineering, environmental, right-of-way, and utilities. NCTCOG plans to do an update to the project funding at a future date to allocate the remaining \$6,000,000.00 needed to complete construction.



NCTCOG Coordination

- Staff has been regularly attending the Regional Transportation Council and Surface Transportation Technical Committee meetings in Arlington as the project has gone through the NCTCOG and state processes.
- The project was recommended to be added to the State's Transportation Improvement Plan (STIP) at the May 10, 2018 RTC meeting.
- Project funding was approved by the RTC at the June 14, 2018 meeting.
- The project is anticipated to receive state approval in August/September, and Federal approval in October/November.

TxDOT Coordination

- TxDOT will be the reviewing authority for all processes as the project moves through environmental clearance, right-of-way, engineering design, and construction.
- Staff has been meeting and coordinating regularly with TxDOT staff over the past 4 months, and is working on processing all of the documents that TxDOT requires to formally begin a major transportation project.
- A formal advanced funding agreement (AFA) with TxDOT will be brought to the City Council for approval later this year. This agreement defines each organization's role, and creates the funding mechanism for the project.

Next Steps

- Staff will return to the City Council with a finalized AFA and budget for projects in August.
- An RFQ for consultant services will be finalized this summer and put out for responses in late summer/early fall.
- Once the Federal approval is received, staff will be able to move forward with preparing a consultant agreement for the City Council to approve, which will kick off the environmental and engineering design processes.
